Following this, the Bank of Wallis-and-Futuna (BWF) with its head office in Wallis was created in 1991.

Thus, Futuna is subjected to periodic earthquakes, the most recent occurring in March of 1993. The topography is more pronounced than on Wallis, with hills rising to 524 m / 1,719 ft. (Mt. Puke on Futuna) and 417 m / 1,368 ft. (Mt. Kolofau on Alofi). Alofi was inhabited until around 1840, but was abandoned because of a shortage of water.
